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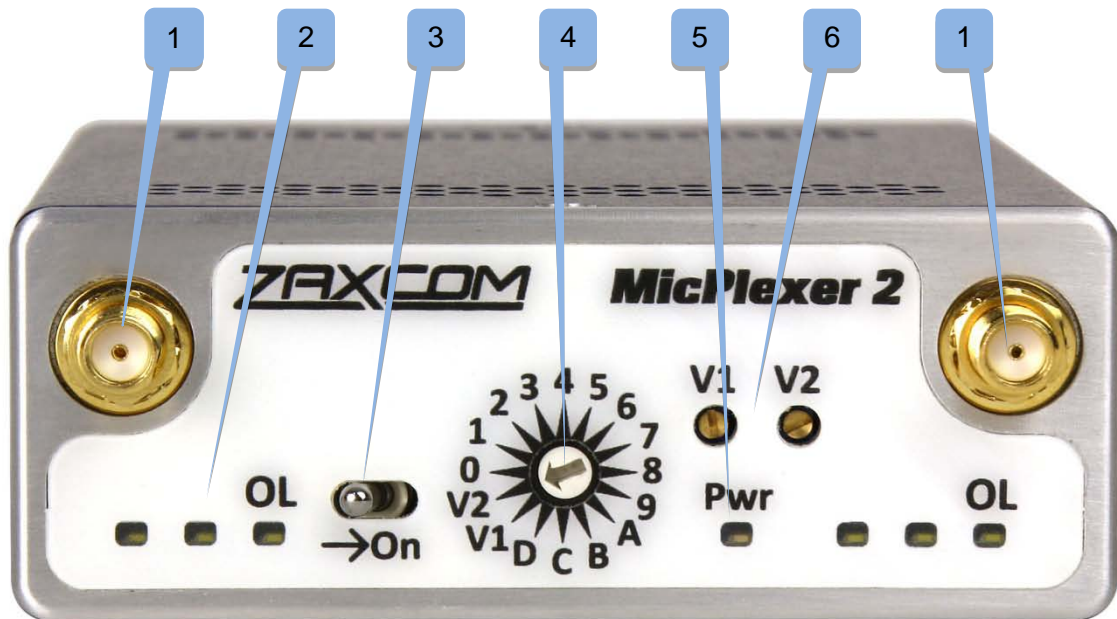
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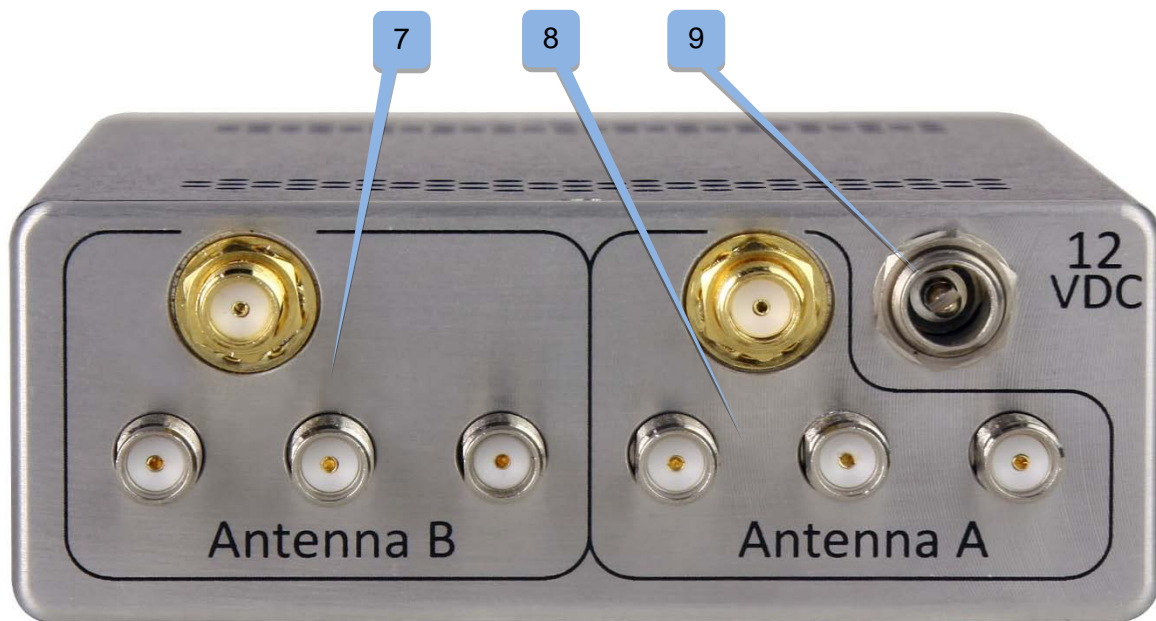
## Knowing your MicPlexer2

### Front



1. SMA Antenna in Connection (2) SMA – Use only 50 Ohm connectors.
2. Overload LEDs
3. Power Switch
4. 16 Position Frequency Adjust Dial
5. Power LED
6. User Adjustable Filter Potentiometers

## Rear

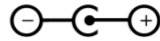


7. Antenna B outputs (4) SMA – Use only 50 Ohm connectors.
8. Antenna A outputs (4) SMA – Use only 50 Ohm connectors.
9. Power connector – Switchcraft 761K

# MicPlexer2 Operations

## Supplying power

The MicPlexer2 uses a Switchcraft 761K locking connector and will accept 8 to 18 volts DC and has a power draw of 90mA at 12 volts. The center pin is wired positive and the ring is negative.



## Connecting input antennas

The MicPlexer2 will receive its signal on the two SMA connectors on the top of the MicPlexer2. If using remote antennas, to ensure optimal performance, use only 50 Ohm low loss coax cable with 50 Ohm connectors and keep the cable run as short as possible. You can connect any proper UHF antenna to the MicPlexer2.

## Connecting output antennas

The MicPlexer2 has 8 SMA connectors on the bottom of the unit. There are 4 SMA connectors that distribute the signal for antenna 1 and 4 SMA connectors for antenna 2. There are no differences in the silver and gold connectors. When connecting the MicPlexer2 to receivers use 50 Ohm low loss coax cable with 50 Ohm SMA connectors and keep the length of the cable as short as possible.

## Selecting a frequency block

The MicPlexer2 has a 16 position frequency select dial on the front of the unit which allows you to change the front end filter on the MicPlexer2. When selecting a position the tunable filter on the Micplexer2 moves the 35MHz window so that only radio frequencies (RF) in the desired frequency range will be received while any unwanted and undesirable RF that is not within the 35MHz window of the tunable filter is rejected.

Using a small screwdriver set the filter on the Micplexer2 to the position (frequency) that you want to operate at.

## Using the Variable inputs

The MicPlexer2 has two user adjustable settings V1 and V2. The variable positions allow you to custom set the center of the 35MHz filter to any frequency desired. This will allow the MicPlexer2 to be customized for any frequency range. This will also allow the MicPlexer2 to cross blocks.

## Setting the variable filter

To set the variable filter you will need a small screwdriver and a transmitter.

1. Set the rotary dial to the desired variable position (V1 or V2).
2. Turn the transmitter on and set it to its lowest output power setting then tune the transmitter to the desired frequency you will be operating it at.
3. Place the transmitter about 3 to 3 feet (.5 to 1 meter) away from the MicPlexer2.
4. Adjust the appropriate potentiometer (V1 or V2) till you see the first position LED just barely illuminate. Turning the pot to right increases the frequency and turning to the left lowers the frequency.

Now the center of the 35 MHz filter for that variable position is set to the frequency of that transmitter, and the useable frequencies for that variable position are 17.5 MHz above and 17.5 MHz below that frequency.

## Overload LEDs

The MicPlexer2 has three overload LEDs for each antenna input. The purpose of these LEDs are to determine if the MicPlexer2 is receiving too strong of an RF signal. If a strong signal, either from your transmitters or some other RF source, is received the RF amp in the MicPlexer2 can overload. If the amp overloads it can desensitize the unit and can cause possible intermodulation interference which will decrease performance.

In most situations there should be no illumination of any of the LEDs. If the left most LED is lit, this should be a warning and you should try to move away from the RF source to get the LED to go out. If the center LED starts to illuminate you may be overloading the MicPlexer2 so you will want to reduce the incoming RF. If the right OL (overload) LED comes on you are overloading the MicPlexer2 and you will need to minimize the RF by moving the antennas away from the RF source or you may even need change the frequency block.

## LED RF indication levels

- Left LED will illuminate when the RF noise floor is at -24dB
- Center LED will illuminate when the RF noise floor is at -18dB
- Right (Overload) LED will illuminate when the RF noise floor is at -14dB

Distributors may sell Product to resellers who then sell Product to end users. Please see below for warranty information or obtaining service. No warranty service is provided unless the Product is returned to Zaxcom Inc. or a Zaxcom dealer in the region where the Product was first shipped by Zaxcom.

## Warranty Policy

The Product carries a Standard Warranty Period of one (1) year.

**NOTE:** The warranty period commences from the date of delivery from the Zaxcom dealer or reseller to the end user.

There are no warranties which extend beyond the face of the Zaxcom limited warranty. Zaxcom disclaims all other warranties, express or implied, regarding the Product, including any implied warranties of merchantability, fitness for a particular purpose or non-infringement. ## Warranty Limitations

These include loss of recorded data, the cost of recovery of lost data, lost profits and the cost of the installation or removal of any Product, the installation of replacement Product, and any inspection, testing or redesign caused by any defect or by the repair or replacement of Product arising from a defect in any Product.
